PRE-KINDERGARTEN

24-count box of crayons, 1 bottle Elmer's glue, 2 rolls of paper towels, 1 box of tissues, 2 glue sticks, baby wipes, Ziploc bags (1 box quart sized, 1 box gallon sized), Magic markers (washable). Also, please send these items, labeled: 2 pocket folders, a smock (an old button shirt from Dad is fine), a lunch bag for daily snack, a backpack for bringing things to and from school (no wheels, please, because they don't fit in the lockers), a complete change of clothes to keep in locker (socks, top, pants and underwear).

For Tech: headphones in a baggie labeled with name.

KINDERGARTEN

1 box of 16 Crayola Crayons (classic colors), 2 marble composition notebooks, 1 pocket folder (pockets on the bottom), 2 regular sized boxes of tissues, a refill package of baby wipes, 6 school glue sticks (white — no blue), 1 backpack, baggies (sandwich, quart or gallon sized).

For Tech: headphones in a baggie labeled with name, box of tissues.

FIRST GRADE

Scissors, bottle of glue, 2 glue sticks, sharpened pencils, erasers (pink pearl), crayons, ruler (centimeter and inches), small dry erase board and markers, 2 marble composition notebooks, pocket folder, clipboard.

For Tech: headphones in a baggie labeled with name, box of tissues.

SECOND GRADE

2 folders, 3 marble composition books, dry erase board and marker (no larger than 8 1/2" x 11"), large memo pad for homework assignments, space saver or similar sturdy box (must fit in top locker), box of tissues. The following items should be able to all fit in the space saver box: pencils, erasers, crayons (24 count regular and 8 count jumbo), glue stick, tacky glue (found in craft store), and scissors. Please do not send in Trapper Keepers or binders; we will not use them.

For Tech: headphones in a baggie labeled with name, Ziploc baggies.

THIRD GRADE

5 individual notebooks WIDE RULE (not college rule, the spaces are too small. Getting different colors is helpful. It makes finding them easier.), 1 package of loose leaf WIDE RULE paper, 1 box of crayons and 1 box of markers, 3 folders with two pockets (plastic ones last longer), 1 small glue, 1 assignment pad, 1 scissors, 1 package of pencils with erasers, 2 boxes of tissues, 1 package of baby wipes, 1 ruler, 1 pencil box. Please, do NOT purchase a binder, Trapper Keeper, or rolling backpack. Please purchase a backpack that can be folded and placed in the locker.

For Tech: headphones in a baggie labeled with name, Ziploc baggies, pocket folder labeled with your child's name and teacher.

FOURTH GRADE

1 red pocket folder and matching spiral notebook, WIDE RULE, labeled "READING," 1 blue spiral notebook, WIDE RULE, labeled "MATH," 1 three-subject notebook WIDE RULE, 1 yellow 2-pocket folder, 1 orange 2-pocket folder, pencils (no pens), erasers, package of loose-leaf WIDE RULE paper, crayons and/or colored pencils, scissors, dry erase marker, tacky glue (available at any craft store or WalMart, possible the Dollar Store), 1 large box of tissues. Antibacterial hand cleanser if your last name begins with A-E; baby wipes if your last name begins with F-M; Ziploc bags if your last names begins with N-Z. Please, no binders. Your child will be required to cover four textbooks. Brown paper bags work well, but we know some people prefer to purchase the regular book covers, which is fine.

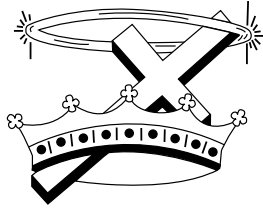
For Tech: headphones in a baggie labeled with name, Lysol wipes, pocket folder labeled with your child's name and teacher.

FIFTH GRADE

Coloring supplies (crayons, colored pencils or markers), supply of dry erase markers (3 or more), 1 package of loose-leaf paper, supply of No. 2 pencils (10 or more). We do not use pens. A highlighter, ruler, scissors, 3 or more glue sticks, thesaurus, dictionary for HOME use, tissues to share throughout the year, an adult-sized shoe box (without the lid), 2 three-ring binders — 1", any color, tab and pocket divider pages (at least 5), 1 composition notebook, 1 sturdy YELLOW folder for homework, one BLUE folder for reading, 2 packages of 3"x5" index cards. Additionally, 1 roll paper towels if your last name begins with A-L, 1 package antibacterial wet wipes if your last names begins with M-Z.

For Tech: headphones in a baggie labeled with name, Lysol wipes, pocket folder labeled with name and teacher.

TECHNOLOGY

GRADES 6-8: Pair of headphones (Dollar store) in a Ziploc bag labeled with your child's name, grade and teacher. A flash drive (128MB or bigger), available at WalMart, Staples or Target, labeled with your child's name, pocket folder labeled with name.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

GRADES 3-5: Writing utensils to leave in class, small 5"x7" multi-subject notebook, 2 packages of index cards.

GRADES 6-8: 10 pencils to leave in Spanish classroom, large 5-subject notebook, 3-ring binder with 10 subject dividers, 5 packages of index cards with card container, bottle of white out.

MATH

GRADE 6: 3-subject notebook (to be used exclusively for math) pocket folder, graph paper notebook, pencils and eraser (mechanical #2 with extra lead), dry erase markers and eraser (in Ziploc bag with name on it), 6-inch ruler (with metric, labeled), protractor (labeled), 1 box tissues. **Additionally**, 6B students will need a dry erase board; 6A students will need a T1 30xII Solar (Scientific Calculator, labeled).

GRADE 7: 3-subject notebook (to be used exclusively for math) pocket folder, graph paper notebook, pencils and eraser (mechanical #2 with extra lead), dry erase markers and eraser (in Ziploc bag with name on it), T1 30xII Solar (Scientific Calculator, labeled), 6-inch ruler (with metric, labeled), protractor (labeled), **Additionally**, 7B students will need a package of disinfecting wipes; 7A students will need a box of tissues.

GRADE 8: 3-subject notebook (to be used exclusively for math) pocket folder, graph paper notebook, pencils and eraser (mechanical #2 with extra lead), dry erase markers and eraser (in Ziploc bag with name on it), 1 package mechanical pencils for classroom. **Additionally**, 8B students will need a T1 30xII Solar (Scientific Calculator, labeled), 6-inch ruler, compass and protractor; 8A students will need a TI 83 Plus calculator (nothing else will be accepted, labeled) and a dry erase board.

SOCIAL STUDIES

GRADES 6-8: 3-ring notebook with numerous pocket folders to hold handout information, note sheets and assignments, pens, pencils, highlighter.

RELIGION

GRADE 6: 1 3-subject notebook, supply of pens, pencils and 3 highlighters, 1 book cover/sock to fit a 9"x7" Bible, 1 book mark.

GRADES 7-8: one 1-1/2" 3-ring binder, five divider sheets with tabs to use in the binder, a pen/pencil bag with grommets that can be used in the binder, supply of pens, pencils and 3 highlighters, a notebook for personal journal entries, a pillow to keep at school to be used during meditation (Please put the pillow in a plastic bag that can be sealed), a can of Lysol or any disinfectant that can be sprayed on the pillow after each use. All supplies should be labeled.

SCIENCE

GRADES 6-8: 3-ring binder with 4 dividers for homework assignments, chapter note sheets, tests/quizzes, and science fair information. It will be collected and checked periodically. Loose leaf paper to be stored in binder, pencils, blue/black ink pens. 6th grade science needs \$3.50 for goggles (school will purchase), 7th grade needs a scientific calculator.

ENGLISH

GRADES 6-8: 1 marble bound journal, 1 3-hole punched folder, 1 1" binder, loose leaf paper, blue and/or black ink pens, box of tissues, package of antibacterial wipes. All supplies should be labeled with name, subject and grade level.

ART

GRADES 6-8: drawing pencils (a set of HB, 2B, 2H, an ebony drawing pencil, a charcoal pencil), a good pencil sharpener and drawing eraser (magic rub, art gum). A fine point black Sharpie marker plus an extra or ultra-fine Sharpie marker. Colored pencils (any 12 pack is acceptable though color varies by brand), drawing pad (a ring bound pad is fine. Free hardcover pads are available at school but they are a little harder to lay flat). Note: teacher has the above items in the classroom, but would like students to have their own supplies at home for take-home assignments or make-up work. Check WalMart and Staples for all supplies.

ALL GRADES: Please refer to other side for additional requirements.
